# MARY CONNOLLY COMMUNITY CARING AWARD

Kimberly Santulli resides in Prospect, and has for most of her life, but considers Naugatuck a second home. She worked in Naugatuck for over 10 years, starting her career at Sarracco Mechanical Services, Inc., located in the Naugatuck Industrial Park until 2016, and then the business moved to Waterbury, CT, where she worked until 2020. She is currently an Associate Accountant for the State of CT's Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection.

While working for Sarracco, she attended many fundraising events, including the infamous YMCA Silent Auction. After several years of bidding on baskets, she became intrigued by the event and curious as to how such a fun and successful event was organized, so she reached out to the YMCA and became a volunteer for the 2011 Silent Auction. Cathie Mauritz showed her the ropes, teaching her how to make baskets, raise money for the community, while having fun doing it.

She became a YMCA board member in 2015, continuing to help and volunteer at the Silent Auction, the Send a Kid to Camp Campaign dinner, and golf tournament. She retired from the board in 2021. In 2014, she received the Naugatuck YMCA Robert Whittemore Unsung Hero award.

Kim was also involved in the Naugatuck Chamber of Commerce, and volunteered on the Duck Day Committee from 2013-2016, working with the Haunted House crew and selling ducks. Who could forget washing and drying thousands and thousands of ducks at the car wash the day after the event.

In 2013, Kim became a member of the Naugatuck Rotary. She was a board member and served as President from 2017-2018. She organized the annual Paul Harris Award Dinner, Annual Dinner, many, many golf tournaments, and Celebrity Waiter dinner. She retired as member in 2020 but became a Friend of Rotary and continues to volunteer on the Special Events Committee.

Kim joined the United Way Board in 2018. She volunteered on the Allocations Committee in 2018 and 2021, which gave her insight into many of the non-profits that United Way supports and what programs they help fund. She is on the Special Events Committee for the Annual Campaign. Every year, she volunteers at the golf tournament, which is an event she looks forward to. In 2017, she became the co-chair of the Gobble Til You Wobble bar crawl. It has grown every year since its conception, and last year the event had its biggest attendance yet, almost 200 people! She is currently the Secretary of the Board.

In 2024, the Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection (DESPP) created a Diversity Committee that is committed to educating all DESPP employees on the value of diversity in the workplace and celebrating the many different perspectives and identities within their workforce. When approached by her supervisor to see if she was interested in joining, she jumped at the opportunity to get more involved at work. It has been a great way to meet more of her coworkers and work together towards a common goal.

One of Kim’s passions is swimming, and many years after swimming in high school and college, she was given the opportunity to become an Assistant Coach for the Long River Middle School swim team in 2017 and an Assistant Coach for Nonnewaug High School swim team in 2019.

Her newest – and most notable – volunteer position, is becoming a board member for the ZTTK Foundation. Her son Miles was diagnosed with a very rare genetic disorder in 2024 called ZTTK. Kim volunteered for this role to help raise awareness and use her fundraising knowledge to raise funds to hopefully one day find a cure so Miles can have the best future possible.

In her spare time, Kim enjoys baking and spending time with her husband, Mike. Besides Miles, they also have a 3-year-old dog named Bernard.
