As I reflect on my second year as Board President and 18th year as a volunteer of the United Way of Naugatuck and Beacon Falls, I find myself proud and excited of what this organization has been able to accomplish this past year. Although being one of the smallest United Ways in the State of Connecticut, we have been able to accomplish many big things! This is all due to an extraordinary team of volunteers, partner agencies, sponsors, and employees that make up our organization. Together we all share the commitment of improving the communities of Naugatuck and Beacon Falls. This year we were able to increase our newly formed Tocqueville Society which now has 10 donors, we've added 14 new members to the Salem Society, and have 16 members that have increased their donations by 10% or more! Each year, I find myself more amazed at the amount of volunteers, volunteer hours, and financial commitment that goes towards making each annual campaign a success. It is inspiring, humbling, and a privilege to be a part of.

With the leadership of Co-Chairs David Mulhall and Rebecca Zandvliet we have been able to raise funds through employee campaigns, fundraising events, and special donors. I would like to extend my sincerest gratitude to this duo. Their willingness, dedication, and teamwork has led our 2022 campaign to success. I am proud to report that we will exceed our 2022 campaign goal of \$450,000! Funds raised are carefully allocated to various partner agencies; this is done through our Allocations Committee led by Stephen Pretto. The committee is comprised of several community leaders and professionals. Together, with Stephen's leadership and guidance, they review all funding applications thoroughly and thoughtfully. They then meet with the agencies as part of the application process and determine funding amounts to each program. I would like to personally thank Stephen and his team. Their dedication to our community, attention to detail, and desire to help is unmeasurable. It is because of this committee that our United Way is able to be as efficient and effective as we are with funding. Thank you.

I would like to thank Marylou Cunningham and the Marketing committee for their commitment and work. They do an awesome job in creating articles profiling volunteers, donors, and partner agencies. This committee keeps our United Way in the forefront of our communities by utilizing print media, and social media, also broadening our reach when searching for new volunteers, donors, and potential new partner agencies. ## MARY CONNOLLY COMMUNITY CARING AWARD



Larry Erickson was born and raised in Boston MA and spent much of his young adulthood in the restaurant trade where he learned from his uncle Les Erickson, who owned several Brighams restaurants. Larry experienced all levels of the hospitality industry while working and managing local bars, hotels and high volume restaurants in Boston, notably the Salty Dog. While managing the Salty Dog one summer, Larry met his wife, Carla Perugini, a waitress at the time, and a few years they later moved to Prospect CT, the town where Carla grew up. Larry and the Perugini Family opened the former Bunkers Restaurant in Naugatuck in 1996 and named it Jesse Camille's, in recognition of John, also known as,

Jesse, and Camille Perugini, Carla's parents, and their daughter, Jesse Camille. For the last 27 years, Jesse Camille's Restaurant & Catering has been home to hundreds of events and remains the "Cheers" of Naugatuck.

Settling in Connecticut nearly 30 years ago, Larry and Carla have four children, Jesse, Michael, Carly and Samantha. In 1998, Carla's sister, Camille, also known as, Candy Perugini, who was also a co-founder of Jesse Camille's, passed away unexpectedly from an undiagnosed medical condition. In her memory, the family established the Camille B. Perugini Trust Fund to keep her passion for education alive by awarding scholarships to area high school students. Through numerous fundraising events chaired by Larry and Carla, notably the annual "Candy's Tourney" golf event, the trust committee has awarded over 255 scholarships in excess of \$262,250.00 to area high school students over the years. Larry has also volunteered for the past 5 years with Hank Witkoski in raising over \$20,000 for the Ecumenical Food Bank in Naugatuck with the annual "Golf Fore Good" golf marathon. Through the restaurant, Larry has supported countless local community and school organizations with donations and hosting fundraising events.

Larry's love of hockey brought him to the Watertown Youth Hockey nearly 21 years ago when he enrolled his 4 year old son in their program. His personal passion for the sport quickly led him to take over as President of Watertown Youth Hockey in 2012, and still serves in that position today. Larry dedicates countless hours to the children and parents involved in that program, fostering his love of hockey to the families of Connecticut. During his time as President, he has organized numerous fundraising events to support families in Watertown experiencing very sad and life altering changes. With the help of the Boston Bruins, Larry organized several charity hockey games to raise funds to help families, including funds that were used to purchase a vehicle for a family that lost their dad and to establish a free learn to skate scholarship program which is now in its 4th year, introducing hundreds of local children to hockey.

In 2015, Larry helped co-found along with Pete Whitney and Tim Richter the Post University Men's Hockey Program, which is NCAA Division 2, Northeast 10. A year later, the Women's Hockey Program was born and entered in the NEWHA Division 1 NCAA. Larry is particularly proud of these programs, and last year, the men's hockey team played in the NCAA championship game. Larry spent time coaching the men's team, but travel proved difficult with his commitment to his restaurant. He now serves as the Director of Hockey Operations for both the men's and women's hockey teams at Post University.

Larry has also been recognized as a recipient of the Paul Harris Award by the Naugatuck Rotary (2013) and the Champions Award for Citizen of the Year (2018) given annually by the Exchange Club of Naugatuck, of which he is also a member.

Larry is the perfect example of what the Mary H. Connolly Community Caring Award embodies and is humbled and honored to receive this recognition.

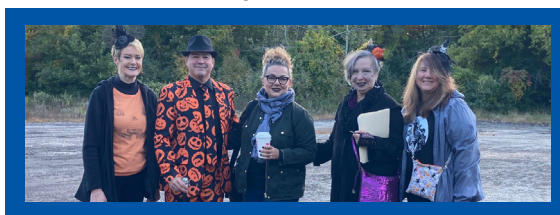
