MARY CONNOLLY COMMUNITY CARING AWARD

Bob Mezzo is a lifelong Naugatuck resident educated in its public schools. He graduated from the University of Connecticut with a B.A. in political science and history and UConn Law School with a J.D. After practicing law for 11 years, Bob was elected mayor of Naugatuck in 2009, serving three terms in office through 2015. At the end of his last term, Bob changed careers and accepted a position in commercial lending at Ion Bank. He currently is a First Vice President, Commercial Lending, concentrating in commercial real estate transactions. Bob has been

married for 28+ years to Eileen (Sorcinelli) Mezzo, a 36 year educator in Naugatuck Public Schools. They share three children, Ally, 27; Jay, 23 and Jack, 14. Bob has spent the majority of his free time coaching countless student athletes continuously since 1994. He has a lifetime of friends and memories through his involvement with Naugatuck Pop Warner, Union City Little League, YMCA Little Pal Basketball, Naugatuck Basketball Association and Naugatuck Youth Soccer. He has also been an assistant for Naugatuck Greyhound Tennis and City Hill Cyclones Baseball. Bob is an active parishioner and Eucharistic Minister at Holy Rosary Church in Ansonia, Eileen’s childhood parish. Bob previously served under Mayor Taf as a Burgess and one term as Deputy Mayor. He currently is the chair of the Naugatuck Board of Education, a board member of the Naugatuck Economic Development Corporation and Naugatuck Ambulance, Inc., and does public address for Naugatuck Greyhound football games. Bob served as tri-chair of the 2024 United Way campaign drive with his wife Eileen and Francis Santana.

Eileen Mezzo is currently in her 36th year as an educator in Naugatuck Public Schools, the last 21 as an administrator. She earned her B.A. in education from Mount Saint Mary College, a masters from Fairfield University, and an administrative certificate from Southern Connecticut State University. Eileen currently serves as the Associate Principal at Naugatuck High School after 8 years as the Head Principal at City Hill Middle School. She was recognized as the Connecticut Association of Schools Teacher of the Year in 2004. A native of Ansonia, Eileen moved to Naugatuck in 1997 upon her marriage to Bob. They share 3 children: Ally, 27; Jay, 23 and Jack, 14; all of whom have been educated in NPS. In addition to being a

full time educator and mother, Eileen spent six years supporting Bob and accompanying him on his travels during his time as mayor of Naugatuck. She enjoys spending her free time outdoors hiking, running and traveling to and from her childrens’ numerous sporting events. She has served on the boards of the Naugatuck Arts Commission, Naugatuck YMCA, Juvenile Review Board of Naugatuck Youth Services, Naugatuck Quarterback Club and the community outreach team at Jane Doe No More; as well as being an active parishioner and Eucharistic Minister at Holy Rosary Church in Ansonia, her childhood parish. Eileen has been an organizer for the United Way’s education subcommittee for several years, and served as campaign chair in 2024 along with Bob and Francis Santana.
