The mission of the United Way of Naugatuck and Beacon Falls is to provide organized capability for involving people of our region to care for one another through a voluntary system of human services. The Allocations Committee facilitates this process by interviewing partnering agencies and reviewing their detailed financial applications to determine funding levels for each agency's program. This year the committee recommended funding 27 programs administered through 17 agencies serving Naugatuck and Beacon Falls.

The partnering agencies devoted significant time and effort to complete their application requests for funding. The application packet requires

a brief narrative of their agency, an explanation of the programs presented in this request for funding, and a budget (historical, current, and prospective) for the agency as a whole and the specific programs presented. I applaud the thoroughness and professionalism that agencies exhibit through the energy and effort committed to prepare packets for the committee's review.

I am deeply grateful to the members that served on the Allocations Committee this year. I am inspired by the contributions of our committee members in applying their insight and experience to conduct a detailed review. I am humbled by their willingness to sacrifice time from busy schedules to serve in this capacity and proud of the diligence shown throughout the review process to assure funds were distributed appropriately to the many deserving programs. Their commitment to this process greatly benefits our community.

In conclusion, I would like to thank the donors to the United Way of Naugatuck and Beacon Falls. The donations of volunteered time, funding, and support they provide enables us to continue efforts to improve the lives of those in need.

In March of 2016, the family was blessed by the birth of their grandson, Evan Jeffrey Ortiz, (aka Pat's little Buttercup). Anyone who knows Pat will tell you that her family is clearly the most important piece to her life. Currently, Pat is self-employed which she considers a gift since it affords her precious time with her grandson.

As committed to her family as she is, Pat still manages to find time for her community. Volunteering has been a lifelong passion for her, and the service that she has given to many organizations over the years exemplifies this. In the past, Pat volunteered to spearhead the St.

Francis Confirmation Community Service Town Wide Food Drives. She had been a team member for ten years with the Greater Waterbury Relay for Life, and in the latter years taking on the role as Activity Chair. She created "Lunches for Life" while employed at Naugatuck Valley Savings and Loan, raising approximately \$6,000 in 16 weeks for Relay for Life. She has volunteered for Junior Achievement for many years by teaching one of their programs to elementary school children. Pat was also a past recipient of the Raymond K. Foley Award.

Currently Pat serves on the Board of Directors and Allocations Committee for the United Way of Naugatuck and Beacon Falls and previously served as the Campaign Chair in 2015. For the past four years, she has also served as a Tri-Chair of the annual Festival of Trees. For the past two years, Pat has held a cookie decorating event open to all children in Naugatuck and Beacon Falls in grades K-6 to promote community awareness of the United Way. It is important to Pat to hold an event that the children of these communities can participate in at no cost since many attendees are families on fixed incomes. Attendees include parents, grandparents, or guardians of the children, and many have expressed their delight in having an activity like that to do with their children and are so grateful that this event came to fruition with the help and support of volunteers like Pat.

However, the cookie-decorating event didn't end there. When this year's event ended with extra cookies left over, another volunteer mentioned to Pat that perhaps they could go to a shelter and decorate cookies with the children who were currently living there. In December of 2017, Pat contacted Safe Haven of Greater Waterbury and asked if they might be able to go to the shelter and do just that. That was when part two of the Cookie Decorating event was born, and it will continue to be an annual event. Even if there aren't any leftovers, Pat and her crew will be sure to make more cookies!

In addition to the United Way, Pat is currently involved with other organizations in the community. She is a member of the Jane Doe No More Events Committee and continues to volunteer in various roles for Naugatuck High School's Grad Night, after co-founding it in 2001. Pat is proud to still be a part of this event, which will be celebrating its 19th year this June.

Pat truly believes that being part of a community includes volunteering, and her life demonstrates that belief. It is her conviction that it doesn't matter whether the role you take on is big or small. What does matter is your passion, "If you are passionate about what you do, you will make a difference."
